Study session scheduling


Section Three

Proceed straight to the end of the red carpet for student drop-offs


Procession End: cars to exit left onto Appleton Drive



Staff.






Section Two

Cars participating in the red-carpet arrivals will follow the green route along Anzac Parade, south-bound, where arrivals will commence in the KBSC car park.

- Procession will continue through to KBSC car park
- Cars will keep left on entry through to the end of the road, U-turn and pull up at the northern end of the redcarpet (following the green route)
- Students will exit the car at the northern end of the red-carpet and walk south along the red carpet
- After completion of the red carpet, students will walk around the bend of the carpet and head back towards the building (following the red route)
- After drop offs, cars will exit the area, keeping left to the end of the KBSC car park, exiting via left turn onto Appleton Drive (following the yellow route)
- Barricading up to assist with spectator/crowd control (black line)
- Space available for spectators (blue)

5:00 pm Red carpet arrival at Keppel Bay Sailing Club

Students arrive from the street procession and step onto the red carpet where their walk

along the red carpet is live streamed via Yeppoon SHS Facebook page

Students will walk along the red carpet to the end of the drive, before exiting the carpet

left and proceeding to the Sailing club

Note: Guests are welcome to observe from the designated spectator sections, or via the televised livestream on the large screen inside the Main Sail bar of Keppel Bay Sailing Club

6:30 pm Students will begin to enter the function space, Commodore Room and Telltales Bar

6:45 pm Keppel Bay Sailing Club catering; 2 course meal, alternate drop

DJ entertainment throughout the evening

11:00 pm Formal concludes

Students are expected to make suitable travel arrangements from the venue

At the end of the function students are responsible for ensuring the safe transport from the venue into parent care. Parents may collect their student from the Keppel Bay Sailing Club during the night after 10 pm and before 11:15pm via driving into the car park and collecting their child from the entrance to the Keppel Bay Sailing Club.

Formal information and requirements

The success of this event is made possible by students behaving appropriately during the evening. If a student is in breach of any Rules and Expectations outlined in this document, the student will be removed from the 2025 Senior Formal and not be able to stay at the venue. Once removed, they will either be collected from the venue by their parents/carers, or they will be sent home in a taxi at the expense of parents/carers. This event is a formal function, and an appropriate standard of dress and exemplary behaviour on the night is required. As this function is voluntary and not a compulsory part of our educational service, the Principal reserves the right to refuse student attendance.

Expectations and eligibility

To be eligible to attend the 2025 Senior Formal, the following explicit expectations apply:

- Students are to have met the senior privileges including:
 - all absences explained
 - must not have three (3) or more 'needs attention' or 'unacceptable ratings for behaviour and/or effort for Term 3 reporting
 - any student who is on Stage 1 Cancellation of enrolment is ineligible
 - no 1-10-day short suspensions
 - long term 11+ day suspension cannot be appealed and deem a student ineligible
 - all outstanding library resources returned
 - all school accounts paid in full or a payment plan in place with at least three payments made to demonstrate commitment to the payment plan
- Students are expected to demonstrate our STARS expectations.
- The 2025 Senior Formal is not a compulsory part of our educational service; it is a voluntary activity offered by the school with staff volunteering their time and services to supervise the students.
- Attendance at the 2025 Senior Formal is a privilege. Any demonstrated inappropriate behaviours, lack of subject engagement or outstanding financial obligations up until and including the day of the formal will result in loss of Formal privileges, regardless of bookings (vehicle, beauty etc.) made by students or their parents/caregivers.
- Year 12 graduating students that are deemed eligible to attend formal are welcome to invite any guest to walk the red carpet as their partner. All red-carpet participants are required to adhere to dress code expectations of socially acceptable formalwear/attire.
- Transport to and from the formal venue is the responsibility of students, parents/carers.
- The dress code for this event is formal. The school will not dictate fashion choices however students are expected to be dressed in socially acceptable formalwear/attire.
- Given this is a school event, students are not permitted to drink at the event, regardless if they are already 18. This includes in the Main Sail of the Keppel Bay Sailing Club.
- This event will be supervised by Yeppoon SHS teaching staff and administration staff. Respectful adult behaviour must be exhibited to other students, teaching staff, security staff and external staff at all times. Any instructions/directions given by security personnel or Yeppoon SHS teaching staff are to be promptly followed.

Formal payments

Ticketing goes on sale from Tuesday 14th October through to Wednesday 12th November.

The cost for admission to the 2025 Senior Formal is \$100 per ticket.

Students are permitted to purchase <u>one</u> ticket for themselves to attend the formal evening located in the function rooms of Keppel Bay Sailing Club from 6:30 pm.

Tickets can be purchased through TryBooking via a link provided to student's school email, whom have been deemed eligible to purchase in alignment to the criteria on Page 11. Please note, ticket purchases made by ineligible students will be notified to HOD Senior School immediately and a refund will be actioned.

Please note: The school does not profit from the sale of Formal tickets.

Due to the substantial coordination required to ensure the success of this event and the extra workload placed on the organising staff, **no Formal tickets can be purchased outside of the purchasing period stated above**. Students are therefore encouraged to make payment well before the due date to secure their 2025 Senior Formal ticket. Bookings must be made based on accurate numbers. Once a booking has been made, it cannot be changed.

QCAA Year 12 results

- Statement of Results (students who have completed a QCAA subject who are not in Year 12)
- Queensland Certificate of Education (QCE)
- Queensland Certificate of Individual Achievement (QCIA).

Senior education profile for Year 12 students

Students completing Year 12 in Queensland from 2020 will be issued with a senior education profile. Included in this profile could be:



Senior Statement

The Senior Statement is a transcript of a student's learning account. The Senior Statement shows all QCE-contributing studies and the results achieved that may contribute to the award of a QCE.

If a student has a **Senior Statement**, then they have satisfied the completion requirements for Year 12 in Queensland.



Queensland Certificate of Education (QCE)

The Queensland Certificate of Education (QCE) is Queensland's senior school qualification, which is awarded to eligible students, usually at the end of Year 12. The QCE recognises broad learning options and offers flexibility in what, where and when learning occurs.



Queensland Certificate of Individual Achievement (QCIA)

The Queensland Certificate of Individual Achievement (QCIA) recognises the achievements of students who are on individualised learning programs. To be eligible, students must have impairments or difficulties in learning that are not primarily due to socioeconomic, cultural or linguistic factors.

ATAR results will be released from 12pm on Thursday 18 December 2025.

Offer Rounds

QTAC Applications are now open for the new admissions period, and the application process is completed online. The due date to apply and submit documentation is Monday 8 December 2025. Offer round commences 23 December 2025 and main offer round from 15 January 2026.

You cannot change your preferences after the final date for the respective offer round. Participation in early offer rounds is at the discretion of each institution.
