- Building teacher capacity through consistent moderation processes, lesson observations, profiling and walkthroughs.
- Additionally, resourcing our Hospitality and Manual Arts Training Centre to develop career readiness skills for our senior students.
- Employing additional support staff targeting early interventions with students at-risk of disengagement - Community Education Officer, Youth Worker, Administration Officer, Teacher Aide.
